

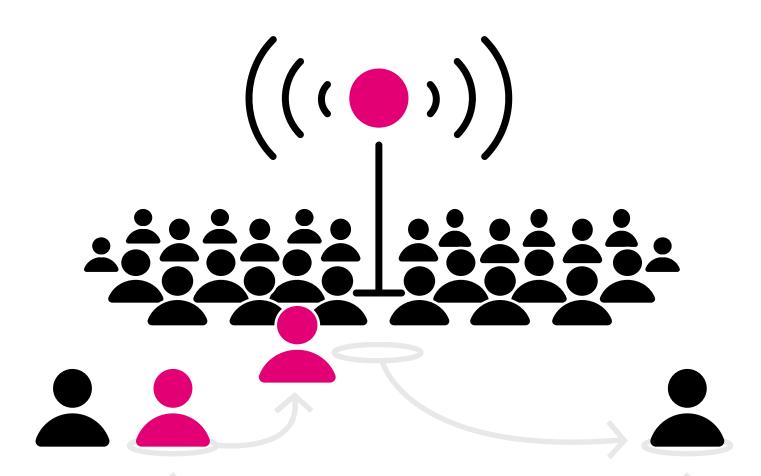
Priority access and preemption

Reliable connectivity for federal agencies.

T-Mobile® for Government provides easy enrollment to federal agencies who need **priority** access and **preemption** during emergency situations on authorized voice and data devices.

How it works:

During an emergency, the network can be severely congested. To ensure government agencies with Wireless Priority Service (WPS) can access our network, we move federal personnel to the front of the line. Non-emergency voice and data services are reorganized, allowing the most urgent communications to get through first.



Priority access

Federal personnel with WPS get moved to the front of the communication line.

Preemption

A non-priority user without WPS is dropped off the network to make room for the priority federal caller with WPS.

End-to-end prioritization

Using WPS by dialing *272 or using the GETS/WPS app provides end-to-end call prioritization, even if the recipient is on a different network.

Wireless Priority Service (WPS) requires approval from Cybersecurity Infrastructure and Security Administration (CISA), an agency within the Department of Homeland Security.
